2450 - ADULT EDUCATION

The Board of Education may provide adult education programs in the evening and day for youths who have completed twelfth grade and any person over the age of eighteen (18) years.

The purpose of adult education programs shall be to meet the academic, vocational, avocational, cultural, and aesthetic, interests of the community. In order to support a program of adult education, the Board may:

- A. appoint a community education director
- B. employ staff
- C. use school facilities and equipment as required
- D. set the cost of each course
- E. provide the necessary custodial services.

The Board of Education believes that education is a continuous process throughout life and supports the position that the District should cooperate with other community agencies in providing educational, cultural, and recreational opportunities for all of its citizens. The school, in this setting, becomes a force for community service and improvement; and the values the community seeks for children in the regular school program are, thus, available for all citizens through the community and/or adult program.

With regard to community education, the Board may provide programs

(x) in the evening

(x) and day

for the purpose of meeting the

(x) avocational,

(x) recreational,

(x) cultural

interests of the community.

(x) as well as the vocational/technical training and retraining needs of local workers.

With regard to adult education, the Board also may provide a

(x) basic

(x) high school

continuation program as an opportunity for anyone over the age of sixteen (16) who is not attending high school

(x) in this District

and, if under the age of eighteen (18), has a currently-valid Age and Schooling certificate issued by the Superintendent or by the student's district of residence to complete the requirements for a high school diploma.

[x] The Board shall also maintain an Americanization program of instruction for the benefit of foreign-born residents of the District.

The Superintendent shall develop and implement administrative guidelines whereby the schools are available to citizens of the District for the above-stated purposes.

The director shall utilize appropriate staff members, invite the participation of representatives of the community, cooperate with local organizations and agencies and assess the needs and resources of the community to develop a program of adult education and present that program to the Board for information.

Such program shall not be inconsistent with the policies of this Board.

The program of adult classes shall be maintained at no cost to the Board. Participating students shall provide all supplies necessary to the accomplishments of their program.

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The Superintendent is directed to seek out and utilize such Federal and State and private sources of revenue as may be appropriate for the financial support of the adult education program.

All out of school youth and adult residents of this District and neighboring districts are eligible for attendance in adult classes.
